It has been an eventful year at the Catholic Schools Endowment Foundation!

I have now passed my first six months of my role as Executive Director at CSEF and every day I become more committed to our mission of making Catholic schools affordable to all who wish to attend.

Catholic schools in Western Oregon offer high quality education for the whole student: mind, body and soul. They are nurturing young minds, shaping citizens of tomorrow, and providing a sense of community and tradition in a changing world.

But many of our schools are facing an uphill battle to keep students enrolled, as tuition and costs increase, and families across the state struggle to make ends meet. For the 2022-23 school year, CSEF distributed over \$680,000 in tuition assistance to 554 families in our Catholic elementary schools in Western Oregon. This is a wonderful achievement and I thank you all for your contributions that make that possible—but it is only a small fraction of what will be needed to keep Catholic schools affordable.

That is why I spend most of my time trying to get the word out about our organization and its critical mission. If you have not heard from me yet, I hope you will give me a call and we can talk about how CSEF is aiming to expand to meet this tremendous need.



Located in an underserved neighborhood of North Portland, Holy Redeemer School is an elementary school with 254 students enrolled. Sixty percent of those students are receiving tuition assistance of some kind. Deirdre McPheeters, the new principal at Holy Redeemer, emphasized that the school relies on the generosity of its supporters. "We are so grateful just to be able to keep the doors open," McPheeters says.

Having put three children through Catholic schools herself, Principal McPheeters feels committed to the mission of the school and part of a broader family of Catholic school supporters. "During Covid, making sure we could stay open was like a family responsibility," Principal McPheeters said. And in fact, there is a family connection; her great aunt was one of the group of nuns who founded the school back in 1908!

Since its beginnings at the turn of the century, Holy Redeemer has survived in the changing community by evolving along with the parish it serves. There are now fifteen different languages spoken in the parish, and the school has adapted to serve the 20% of students who speak Spanish as a first language. Holy Redeemer attracts students from as far away as Vancouver, WA because the academics and the sense of community are stronger than what public school counterparts have to offer.



The school offers "buddy classes" so that older children can guide the younger students—8th graders paired with 4th graders, whilst the 4th graders are themselves mentoring the kindergarteners. The buddies complete weekly projects as well as attending Mass together. In addition to the community aspect, the spiritual development of students is also paramount, with prayers in the morning and at the end of the day, as well as daily blessings and religion classes for all students.

Just one of the thirty-eight elementary schools in the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, Holy Redeemer serves as an example of a community institution that can benefit from support from outside the parish it serves. Because CSEF provides tuition assistance to students across the Archdiocese based on who has the highest need, your donation to CSEF will help Holy Redeemer continue to offer an excellent Catholic school education to families who need your help the most.
